

# Traditional Oil Painting

Oil paint is a medium which is rich in history. It has been used for centuries and if applied correctly is long lasting as we see in museums today. The paint is full of body and chroma. It may be used in an impressionistic way or applied with glazes as seen with the Dutch Masters.

This course will cover the traditional methods of oil painting from the French academy under-painting to a finished piece. Students will learn the fundamentals for creating a painting including composition, color, and techniques. Course focus and teacher demonstrations will include landscape and still life. Students may choose from provided subject matter or bring in their own inspirational references.



***Returning and advanced students may focus in one area (still life, landscape, or portraiture) and with guidance work from their own ideas.***
